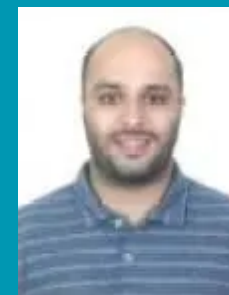

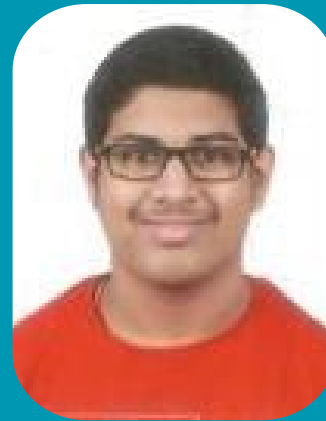

ADMISSION

1. Admission to Std. XI is granted on the basis of Standard X Board results.
2. Students seeking admission to Std. XI are required to submit the following documents:
 - a. Admission Form duly completed.
 - b. Original Statement of Marks of S.S.C. Examination along with its photocopy.
 - c. School Leaving Certificate in original.
 - d. Copy of Aadhaar Card and Birth Certificate.
 - e. Three passport sized photographs.
 - f. Photographs of the Parents/Guardian.
3. Students who have passed Std. X Examination from Boards other than the Goa Board, should apply for Eligibility Certificate for Std. XI. Admission will not be confirmed till obtainment of Final Eligibility from the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.
4. Student admitted in the First Term will be considered as duly enrolled for the whole academic year. If the student intends to leave the school, he/she should inform the Principal in writing at least a week before the commencement of the Second Term.
5. **As per rules there will be reservations of seats for OBC-27%, SC-2% and ST-12%**
6. Students of this Higher Secondary School, passing Std. XI exam are eligible to apply for admission to Std. XII. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any student with an unsatisfactory conduct or academic record.
7. A student under jurisdiction of the Goa Board, seeking admission to Std. XII must produce the School Leaving Certificate in original and original Passing Certificate with Statement of Marks of Std. XI Examination along with a photocopy thereof. A student from any other Board must also produce Eligibility Certificate from the Goa Board along with the Statement of Marks and its photocopy.

ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

Students who seek admission after passing the Std. X Board Examination of a Board other than the Goa Board, are informed as under:

1. Students should apply for Eligibility Certificate to Goa Board on the prescribed form with the prescribed fees of the Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.
2. They should produce the following documents along with the duly filled in form.
 - a. S.S.C./ X Mark Statement - Original + 2 copies (self-attested)
 - b. S.S.C./ X Passing Certificate - Original + 2 Photocopies (attested)
 - c. School Leaving Certificate - Original + 2 Photocopies (attested)(School Leaving Certificate should be counter signed by a competent authority of the Department of Education from that State.)
 - d. Migration Certificate from the Board – Original
 - e. Birth Certificate and Aadhar Card-1 copy

If students fail to obtain Final Eligibility Certificate from the Goa Board on or before December of the academic year, the result of Std. XI examination will not be declared under any circumstance.

All admissions are valid for ONE YEAR and will have to be renewed for each subsequent year.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND RULES FOR REFUND OF FEES

A student cancelling admission to Std. XI must inform the Principal in writing. Fees will be as follows:

1. Before commencement of 1st term: Deduction of Rs. 50/- as administrative charges.
2. Within 30 days of 1st Term : Deduction of Rs. 80/- as administrative charges.
3. After 30 days of 1st term :Deduction of Rs. 100/- as administrative charges.

Students are supposed to collect the deposits within 6 months from the date of leaving the school. If not done, the amount will be treated as unclaimed deposit and will be forfeited.

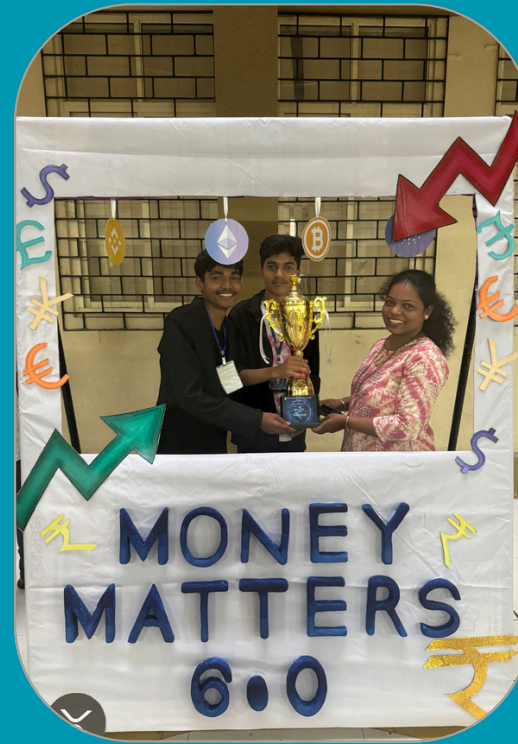

RMS HSS won the Championship Trophy for Money Matters 6.0 organised by Shree Damodar College of Commerce and Economics, Department of Management Studies.



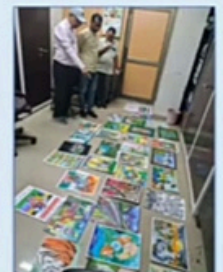

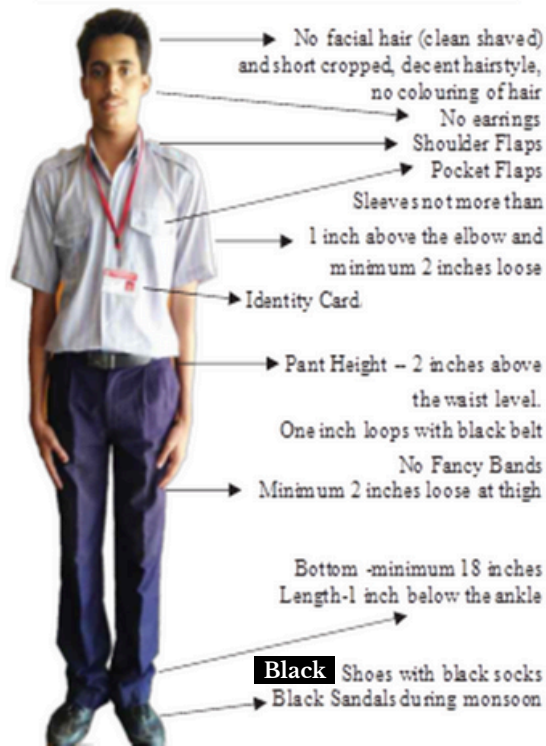

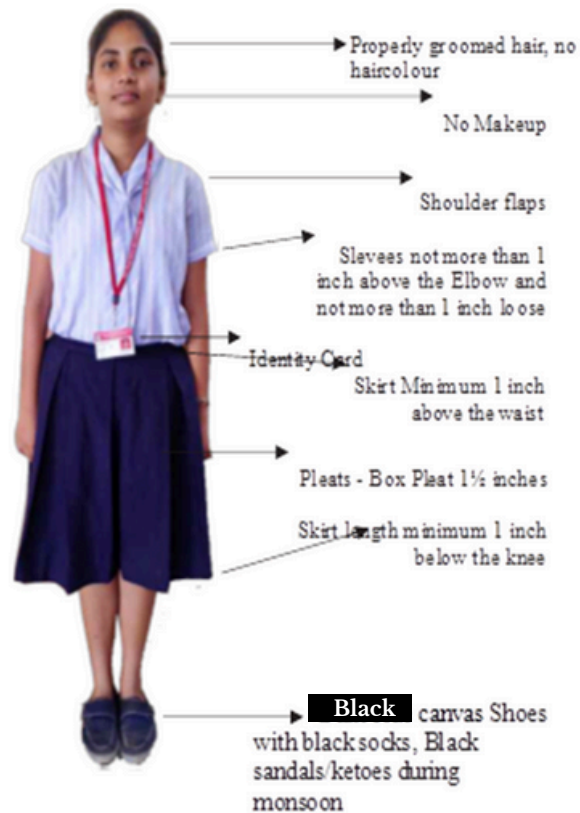

Uniform

1. Uniform colour and pattern as prescribed in the school handbook.

Any violation with respect to the uniform, the student will not be permitted to attend classes until s/he comes with prescribed uniform (Parents will be called to school).

2. Students should report to school in clean and well-pressed school uniform. It is also compulsory to wear black shoes (canvas) and black socks and during monsoon black sandals for girls and boys.

DISCIPLINE GUIDELINES ISSUED BY THE DIRECTORATE OF EDUCATION UNDER GOA SCHOOL EDUCATION RULES 1986

DISCIPLINE VERSUS PUNISHMENT -

A student's discontinuity in the school would be a result of:

1. non-payment of fees and other dues wherever applicable, for 90 days after the last date of payment.
2. the student's continued absence without leave, for 30 consecutive days from the opening day of the scholastic year, in which case, the said student's name would not be considered in the roll call.
3. bad behaviour and non-observance of disciplinary rules.

In case of breach of discipline, the parent or guardian would be given sufficient opportunity to acknowledge or justify the said behaviour. If the Head of the school still finds the student's behaviour detrimental to the general tenor of the school, such a student may be asked to leave the institute and enroll elsewhere.

FORBIDDEN PRACTICES. –

1. No student shall indulge in any of the following practices namely:

- Spitting anywhere in the school premises,
- Disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property,
- **Smoking**
- **Any form of gambling,**
- Use of drugs, liquor or intoxicant, except on prescription by a registered medical practitioner,
- Rowdyism and rude behaviour,
- Use of violence in any form,
- Casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability.
- Ragging,
- Pupils who are found to have secured, admission or attempted to secure admissions by means of false or forged leaving certificates or by false representations of any kind,
- Pupils in whose case it has been found that the entries in the leaving certificates have been tampered with,
- Pupils who have been found to be guilty of fraud or malpractices in connection with any public/school examination,
- Pupils who are found guilty of gross misconduct,
- **Bringing someone impersonating a parent at the time of result or when called due to complaint.**

FORMS OF DISCIPLINARY MEASURES. –

1. The following disciplinary measures will be adopted by the school:

a. Defaulting students can be detained during recess for neglect of classwork. No detention will be carried out after school hours. Also corporal punishment will not be used.

b. Rustication.

2. Expulsion shall debar a student from being re-admitted to the school from where he is expelled, but shall not preclude his admission with the previous sanction of the Director to any other school.

3. Where a student is rusticated, he shall not be admitted to any school till expiry of the period of rustication.

4. No student will be expelled or rusticated from a school except after giving the parent or guardian of the student a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the proposed action, and without prior approval of the Director.

5. Expulsion or rustication shall be resorted to only in cases of gross offences where the retention of the student in the school is likely-to endanger its moral tone of discipline.

6. Students shall not be permitted to post any objectionable material regarding the institution, staff members or any fellow students on the internet and other forms of social media including and not restricted to mobile phone application based messaging media such as Whatsapp, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram. If found guilty, Police complaint will be filed, parents will be informed, undertaking will be taken from the student, student will be expelled.

GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE OF THE HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL

We have no Corporal Punishment policy. Our approach of addressing concerning behavioral problems is through the use of inquiry, Counseling, motivation and inspection.

DISCIPLINE RULES

1. Students are forbidden to bring any valuables/articles to school.
2. The School reserves the right to confiscate any items that are prohibited.
3. Students should not litter the premises, classrooms and laboratories with papers, eatables, etc. or throwing them out of windows. Dustbins should be used for this purpose.
4. Students are prohibited from bringing bikes to the institution as per the circular issued by the Directorate of Education vide Circular no. Acad/Road safety/Misc/ 2016/503 dated. 23/02/2021.
5. Students are to work diligently not only on assigned daily class work, homework, projects and others but also have regular self-revision in order to ensure quality work is produced.
6. AS per the circular DE//Adm/1/511/2005 dated 11/3/2005 issued by the Directorate of Education, Panaji. Use of mobile phones by the students is banned in the school campus during the school hours, if a student is found with a mobile phone, it will be confiscated.

ATTENDANCE

1. Attendance of students at lectures will be watched very strictly. **If a student remains absent for even a single lecture without permission, he/she will be treated as absent for the whole day.**
2. Long absence from School could be permitted on prior approval from the Class teacher & Principal.
3. **Absence on medical grounds has to be accompanied by a medical certificate from a medical practitioner of a Govt.hospital.**
4. If the Student is absent for 2 or more consecutive days, he or she will have to be accompanied by the parents in the absence of a medical certificate and if a student remains absent for more than 3 weeks without prior application for leave of absence, his/her name will be struck off the rolls. In cases of grave illnesses / accident – parent has to ensure that a letter is sent to the Principal informing of the situation within a week.
5. Students who leave the premises without permission during the school hours will have to be accompanied by the parents on the following day failing which they will not be allowed to attend the lectures.

6. Students are discouraged to leave their class between lectures for trifling reasons like drinking water or using the cloak room, etc.
7. Students are to attend all the academic programmes, co-curricular activities, school functions and other school related programmes.
8. Students have to strictly follow the entry and exit timings of the school.
9. All communication between school & home will be recorded in a handbook which is to be carried to school by the student.

IDENTITY CARDS

As part of the uniform students shall wear their id card at all times without which entry in the campus will be denied.

HAIRSTYLE: AS MENTIONED IN THE SCHOOL HANDBOOK

1. Hair must be groomed and in keeping with the decorum of the institution.
2. All boys (Except Sikhs) should have a short, smart haircut.
3. Girls hair should be neat and orderly, hair styles and colour as well as makeup is not permitted
4. Any violation, parents will be called in the school & student will be sent home. Student will be allowed to attend classes only after the necessary changes are carried out.

FORBIDDEN PRACTICES:

1. Students are required to show due regard for the rights and property of the institute. Any student found guilty of tampering/damaging the property, fixtures, equipment, furniture, books, building, vehicles etc. of the school or on the premises (belonging to others) shall be liable to pay for replacement and/or might be liable for expulsion from the institution.
2. A student coming to school under the influence of narcotics, alcohol, tobacco in any form will be dealt with strictly.
3. If any student is found ragging, s/he will be expelled from the institution.
